The above having been said though, the financial situation of the University is quite depressing and precarious, especially due to the spiralling student debt. The Historic Student Debt currently stands at about R350 million and the same has been occasioned by the students' inability to pay their outstanding fees, due to the poor backgrounds from which many of them come.

Whilst the University Community is quite excited, exhilarated and enthused about the State President's announcement of "Free Education" for the first time entrance students and that the scheme will be phased in over a period of five years, the announcement will evidently take away the heavy burden off the shoulders of those parents and/or guardians whose joint family income is up to R350 000-00 p.a, fact of the matter is that the University still has a Historic Debt of R350m.

It is because of this challenge that the University Management deemed it appropriate to make this special appeal for sponsorships and/or financial assistance from the "Good Samaritans" out there to come to the rescue of those students whose situation is so precarious that they cannot afford to wipe off the student debt. The DHET has made announcement on how it would take care of the Historic Debt of the NSFAS Beneficiaries, but the University still needs to play its own part as a sign of its commitment to access to Higher Education. The situation is so dire that to keep quiet about it would simply mean that we, as Management are simply happy with the status quo and yet the opposite is true.

The VUT Management continues to effect and to implement the Council's approved Student Debt Reduction Strategy, but the road ahead is quite arduous and bumpy, hence this appeal. A University is a national asset which cannot be allowed to go under and therefore needs all those who have the best interest in its affairs and those of the Country and not to mention the Sedibeng District Municipality to come on board and give a helping hand. The majority of our students come from extremely poor backgrounds and are accordingly unable to service their debts. Even though faced with this debt, the commitment which many display towards their studies is just amazing, hence a call for financial assistance.

The future of our Country lies in the hands of the present-day generation and so, we have to do our very best to assist those who are academically deserving and financially needy. The Government's announcement of "Community Service" by those who shall have benefitted from the NSFAS resonates with what we are currently pleading for, i.e the VUT's Convocants, Alumni, Members of Staff, Business and Industry and particularly those Service Providers who are doing business with the University to come forward and pledge their financial support for the Institution.
